VISITING THE SCHOOL

All visitors to the school need to sign in at the office. If your child has left their lunchbox at home and you need to deliver it to school, please do not go directly to your child's class – please deliver the item to the office and it will be forwarded on to your child. Parents are not permitted to approach classrooms without signing in at the office first. This ensures everyone's safety.

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

Instrumental lessons are available for students in years 4 - 6. Those students who may be interested in participating will need to complete an instrumental form and return it to the office.

PAYMENTS

Payments to the school can be made either by:

- Cash Cash payments are accepted at school on Thursday and Fridays. Please ensure you write your child's name on the bag/envelope.

Payments to the school are for incursions (performances), instrumental music, Dance Fever programs (Gymnastics, Athletics, Dancing), excursions – anything school based can be paid into the school account.

To ensure an efficient and safe beginning and end to the school day, please do not accompany your child to their classroom in the morning or collect them from their classroom in the afternoon. Please wish your child a good day in the undercover area and resume your normal daily activities. Thank you to all of our parents who are waiting for their child/ren in the designated Parent Plaza. There are a number of reasons we ask you to collect your child from the Parent Plaza: it eliminates congestion in the undercover area and allows for smoother pedestrian traffic flow, students can easily access the footpath to make their way in a timely manner to stop, drop and go and most importantly it ensures the safety of our students. Mr Marios may re-direct you to the Parent Plaza if you are seen to be waiting in inappropriate areas around the school – please respect his request and follow his directions as his main concern as always is the safety of our students.

DANCE FEVER

The company Dance Fever have returned again and will be providing the school with a variety of lessons (gymnastics, dancing, athletics) throughout the year. This term, student's in prep – year 6 will be participating in Mindfulness and Wellbeing Lessons. Students will participate in 10 lessons, commencing next Tuesday. The cost for this activity is \$20 per student and payment will need to be received by Friday 12th February. An invoice has been sent home regarding this activity.

P AND C MEETING

Woodhill State School has a very active P and C who coordinate various fundraising activities throughout the year. These fundraising activities assist with funding school activies and captial works.

The P & C AGM will be scheduled once the accountant has finalised the financial report.

HOMEWORK

We are a homework school. As well as homework going home with your child you can also find it on the webpage. This alleviates the problem of homework going missing.

STOP, DROP AND GO

If you will be using Stop, Drop and Go, please let the school know if you need a new name sign for your car.

If you are using Stop, drop and go please remember:

Do not get out of your car. If your child needs assistance to put on a seatbelt, you

may wish to consider parking and collecting your child.

- Children must exit and enter the car from the passenger's side only.
- Do not overtake unless directed to do so.

PARADE

Although COVID-19 restrictions have eased, our operating guidelines stipulate that we still need to maintain social distancing for adults on the school grounds (1.5 meters). With this in mind, we will be alternating junior and senior parades each Friday to limit the amount of adults we have on site during this time (eg. Parade for preps -2's one week, parade for 3's-6's the following week) Our first parade will be Preps – 2's Friday 12th February.

QPARENTS

QParents website allows parents of Queensland state school students to access information about their child and communicate directly with the school. You will have access to your child's reports, their absence details, any outstanding invoices you may have and positive behaviour records. Registration details will be emailed out to families this week. If you do not receive this email please contact the office to update your email details and your access codes will be emailed to you. COMPLAINTS PROCESS

If you have an issue regarding your child, your first point of contact is always with your child's teacher. Please contact the office to organize a scheduled appointment or contact the teacher via email. If you are not satisfied with the outcome of this appointment then an appointment can be made to see the principal. If you have discussed your complaint with the principal and still feel that you have not reached a resolution, you have the right to contact your local Department of Education and Training office. ABSENCE PROCESS

Safety and wellbeing of students are the highest priorities for the Department of Education. All schools employ a 'same day' absence policy where schools contact parents on the same day their child is absent, if the absence has not already been explained. Woodhill has

implemented an SMS system which will contact you requesting an explanation for your child's absence if you have not already done so by 9:30am. Please assist us by ensuring you contact the office as soon as possible if your child is going to be away from school. The Education General Provisions Act 2006 mandates that every student is required to attend school on every school day of their education program unless they have a reasonable excuse, such as illness. If a student is chronically absent, the Department of Child Safety may be notified and the parents can face prosecution under the Act.

If your child is absent from school, there are a number of ways to notify the school

Failure to notify the school will result in an unexplained absence letter being sent home.

Students are expected to be at school before the first bell and remain at school until 3pm. Please try and schedule appointments outside of these hours. If this is not possible, please send a note to your child's teacher advising what time the student will need to be collected. If you are late for school or need to leave early you **must** come to the office to sign your child in/out and receive an arrival slip or a departure note. Students arriving between 8:45 and 9am will need to go the library and receive a late arrival slip. If you need to change your child's pick up arrangements please contact the school before 2pm. We cannot guarantee that messages will be delivered in time after 2pm. Please also notify the office if someone else will be collecting your child from school - we will not release a student to someone who is not a parent or guardian without your permission.

UNIFORM

The uniform is comprised of the following: GIRLS

School Green Polo Shirt and Plain Black Skirt or Shorts, or School Dress

BOYS

School Green Polo Shirt and Plain Black Shorts. <u>SPORTS UNIFORM</u>

Plain Black shorts or skirt with House Polo Shirt. TRACKSUITS

Plain Green/black tracksuit tops and black pants. <u>FOOTWEAR</u>

Children are required to wear closed-in shoes. Thongs and sandals are not permitted.

For the sake of student modesty, please ensure your child's shorts/skirt are of a suitable length. If your child wears bike pants, they need to be worn under a skirt or shorts, not as a uniform item on their own. Shorts/skirts and long pants all need to be plain black or green – no advertising/stripes/pictures.

PERSONAL APPEARANCE

The following is deemed unacceptable.

- Tattoos
- Make up
- Nail Polish
- Hair Colour (Exceptions are made for children to wear washable sports house colour on sports day)
- Shaved heads-with or without rats tails
- Haircuts that are less than a number two, including tracks and patterns. Please save these for the holidays.

Please ensure your child's uniform items are clearly named as this helps us to return clothing items to their rightful owners.

UNIFORM SHOP

Uniform shop is run by the P and C and is open on Monday mornings. If you can't make it into the school you may place an order using the order form anytime during the week and our wonderful volunteers will fill the order and send it home. MEDICAL INFORMATION

Woodhill State School is committed to supporting students' health and wellbeing. We would appreciate parents/carers providing the school with any relevant health information that is required to support the student at school. This information is also collected at enrolment but needs to be updated regularly, or if a new health condition develops.

Information about medically diagnosed conditions such as allergies, asthma, diabetes and epilepsy and other health conditions that may require school staff to provide support to students, including administering medication and performing health procedures, should be provided to the school along with a Medical Action Plan from your doctor. Information should be provided in writing, and any specific health plans (only to be completed and signed by the medical practitioner) should be included. Please contact the school to discuss any specific requirements.

Please inform the school office staff of any changes to contact details or the contact details of the people nominated as emergency contacts.

Thank you for your assistance in this regard. All information is kept confidential and only disclosed to the relevant staff required to support your child.

BEHAVIOUR POLICY

Woodhill State School participates in the School Wide Positive Behaviour programme which, in simple terms, means that we ensure that our consequences as well as our positive behaviour rewards are consistent throughout the school. Our behaviour consequences grid is attached to this newsletter so that parents and carers are aware of the consequences attached to a particular behaviour. Our Code of Conduct can also be found on our school website.

Each term we reward those students who have demonstrated consistently good behaviour (less than 3 major referrals for a term) with a fun activity.

Awards are also given daily (gotchas) and weekly (student of the week and merit awards).

FOCUS FORTY

"Focus Forty" is a program which aims to actively and directly teach the skills necessary for children to be accepted into and participate effectively in the variety of group situations they will encounter in school. Each week a new topic is introduced and taught to the students. We will advise you of the Focus Forty focus for the week so you can re-iterate those values at home.

Week 1 Introductions: Look at the person, smile, use their name

Week 2 Lining Up: Arrive by the bell, sit in straight lines, legs crossed, hats off, quiet

ZONES OF REGULATION

This year our students will continue to work with 'The Zones of Regulation' program. They have been learning to recognise their emotions and identify which zone they are in. Students have also been developing skills in being able to recognise situations that make them move out of the green zone-known as triggers.

Students have also been learning and practising tools that can help them to regulate their emotions and stay within the green zone, which is the ideal zone for learning.

This week your child has created a toolbox that contains some strategies that they have identified as being helpful for them to regulate their emotions.

Dífferent tools suit dífferent people.

Please discuss the tools with your child. Perhaps they can teach you some of the strategies that they find helpful!

Some Calming Tools

- Learning to take a deep breath
- Six sides of breathing
- Lazy 8 breathing
- Count to 10

Some Thinking Tools.

• Size of the problem

- Inner coach vs. Inner critic
- Superflex thinking vs. Rock Brain thinking
