HEALTH SUPPORT

Schools can assist students with health support needs such as diabetes, epilepsy, asthma and anaphylaxis. If needed, the school can access the State Schools Nursing Service for support to make sure your child is safe at school.

LATE ARRIVALS

We all run late sometimes. For your child, arriving late to school occasionally won't cause major disruption. Inevitably, children will feel sick or tired some mornings, or other situations will prevent them from being on time. But chronic lateness eventually takes its toll on a child's overall educational experience. According to the recent studies, missing just 10 percent of the school year in the early grades causes many students to struggle in primary school, and lateness in later grades is associated with increased failure and dropout rates. Fortunately, parents can help prevent tardiness from becoming frequent enough to negatively impact their child's school life.

LOST PROPERTY

REPORT CARDS

Academic reporting involves communicating with parents, carers and students about student achievement and effort for each learning area. Reporting builds the school-parent partnership to improve student learning. School reporting processes are clear and transparent for parents, so they understand:

- The learning expectations for the students
- The student's achievement against expected standards
- How well the student is engaging with the expected learning; and
- How the student may be able to improve

Formal reporting to parents of a student's progress will take place twice a year. Report cards are emailed to parents, families without access to email are to notify administration so that a paper copy can be issued. It is essential that we have accurate records of parent's email addresses. REWARDS

Woodhill State School believes in rewards for positive behaviour and encouraging better choices, in preference to using consequences as the stick to improving poor choices made by students. Awards are given daily (Dojos) and weekly (student of the week and merit awards). Student of the Week awards are worth 5 points and Merit certificates are worth 3 points. Once a student reaches 8 points they are awarded a bronze certificate, 16 points a silver certificate and 24 points a gold certificate.

TEACHER CONTACTS

If you have any issues or concerns regarding your child, your first point of contact will be with your child's teacher. **Any issues that arise will need to be discussed with them first.** Please do not approach them for a 'chat' when they are collecting their class to start the day, as they need to give their full attention to the students. As teachers have very limited time to return phone calls due to teaching and playground duties, we find that email is a good means of communication. TEAM MEMBER SPOTLIGHT



Hello, my name is Kate Read

I am a Speech Language Pathologist that works for the Department of Education. I visit Woodhill State School once a fortnight and have been supporting the school since 2016. Speech Language Pathologists in schools assess and support students with communication disorders including difficulties with speaking, listening, understanding language, reading, writing, social skills, stuttering, and using voice. We work with people who have difficulty communicating and/or who experience difficulties swallowing food and drinks. Speech-language pathologists work with students, their families and education teams.

I always look forward to my Woodhill visits. The school has such an excellent team of staff and the students are wonderful to work with. The setting and scenery are beautiful and I love seeing Tiger if he is there on one of my visit days!

If you have concerns about your child's communication, you can talk to their class teacher. Schools have referral processes where parents and teachers provide background information and complete a referral form so the student can be considered for Speech Language Therapy services.

UNIFORM

With the weather turning colder, it is a timely reminder of our winter school uniform requirements. Children are required to wear plain black or bottle green jumpers with no writing or designs, or a school jumper. If your child wears bike pants/leggings, they need to be worn under a skirt or shorts, not as a uniform item on their own. Shorts/skirts and long pants all need to be plain black with no advertising/stripes/pictures.

WOODHILL WONDERS

In order to improve the developmental outcomes for students, Woodhill State School has established a pre-prep program called 'Woodhill Wonders'. The program was developed to support children and families to experience a smooth transition to school, which evidence shows is essential for good developmental outcomes. In the pre-prep program, children and their families are invited to join the school for activities each Friday in terms 3 and 4 of the year before they start school. The program was developed collaboratively by the Principal, prep teachers and prep teacher aides.

The program:

- Encourages involvement and social interaction for children, parents and staff
- Assists children with optimal school transition and readiness to engage in all the opportunities offered at school
- Improves parent involvement and relationships with their children and the school
- Helps children become more familiar with their new school environment, other students, teachers and the principal
- Gives children the opportunity for social interaction
